## Main duties and responsibilities

### The teacher will:

- Provide a balanced curriculum and maintain progress of all class members through the relevant subjects at a pace suitable to their age, development and ability, and according to the principles of Steiner-Waldorf education
- following the schemes of work outlined by the Education Mandate, plan and deliver a selection of lessons in the following areas:
  - writing, reading, and the study of English grammar and literature
  - arithmetic, mathematics
  - art (drawing, painting, clay modelling)
  - games
  - drama
- assess and monitor each child's progress against the scheme of work, within relevant subjects
- share responsibility for aesthetic and practical aspects of the classroom environment
- ensure that appropriate work is set and marked promptly so that timely feedback may be provided
- where appropriate, ensure that study materials are available in good time
- maintain discipline at all times, so that the learning objectives of the class and the provisions of the school's Health and Safety policy are met
- help ensure that good study habits are developed in the class
- be willing to ask for and receive assistance from colleagues
- work with a mentor
- be willing to help colleagues when needed, especially in areas of their own experience and expertise
- be willing to mentor colleagues
- liaise with subject teachers with regard to progress and behaviour of the children
- take part in the appraisal of his/her own work performance and be prepared to assist in the appraisal of colleagues
- keep written records of children's progress and make assessments of the children to national norms when required to do so
- prepare individual end of year reports for all children taught

- Organise parents evenings when appropriate
- liaising with class teacher over agreed budgets
- · covering for absent colleagues when necessary
- attending weekly pedagogical meetings
- attending other occasional out of hours meetings when required, and in negotiation with the Administrator/School Management Group/Education Mandate

- attending training where relevant
- sharing responsibility for the supervision of all pupils out of lesson time within the school day
- sharing responsibility for the security of the school premises at the end of the school day
- upholding and maintaining up-to-date knowledge of all school policies (including Health and Safety and Child Protection)
