Role purpose:

To provide academic leadership in relation to course design and delivery and to ensure the ongoing development of a designated course is fit for purpose in delivering an excellent student experience, reporting to the Head Teacher of York Steiner School, working closely with a chosen university and meeting the accreditation criteria of the Steiner Waldorf Schools Fellowship.

2 Days a week for two years initially

The Course – outline

PG Dip in Waldorf Education and MA in Education

Jan - July 2023:

PG Dip in Waldorf Education - 2 modules at L7, 60 Masters credits

Training teachers are embedded in schools for approx 4 days per week, with 1 day 'at' university (online learning or face-to-face). There will be two residential weekends. Focus is on an introduction to Waldorf philosophy, principles and curriculum and building a 'Waldorf toolkit' (art, music, movement, outdoor learning). Assessment will be via academic written assignment (in addition to shorter pieces of work including reflective journaling).

Run by York Steiner School designed in collaboration with/and validated by an English University.

Sept - Dec 24 2023

Post-grad teaching apprenticeship with QTS plus PGCE - 2 modules at L7, 60 Masters credits.

Taught content is half a day every 3 weeks with a university experienced in supporting PGCE students in Independent Schools. Trainees will also attend a placement at a second school. Assessment is via graded observations, reflections and three academic written assignments.
